*When submitting your unit's registration, DO NOT include the Health, Permission Form, or Unit Roster. Those forms will be collected at the Camporee.*

*We ask that you use all Camporee documents, including the Health Form and Permission Form. These are Camporee specific documents and will not be returned to units at checkout, but will be destroyed. Hopefully this will make the checkout procedure quicker.*

**NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER SEPTEMBER 15, 2006.**

### **COST**

The cost per Boy Scout and adult Boy Scout leader is \$12.00. This cost includes the weekend camping fee, use of all shooting sport ranges, use of the climbing tower, all Camporee events and activities, and all awards or patches. There will be no meals served at the Camporee and the registration cost does not include food. Units are responsible for their meals.

The cost per Webelos Scout and Webelos leader is \$6.00. This cost includes the daily camp use fee, use of shooting sport ranges, use of the climbing tower, Camporee events and activities on Saturday, and a Camporee patch. The registration cost does not include meals.

All fees must accompany the initial reservation. Fees may be paid in person by cash, check, or credit card. Checks should be used for mail-in registrations.

Checks should be made payable to *Northern Star Council*.

### **WEBELOS SCOUTS**

Webelos Scouts are invited to the Camporee on Saturday, October 14, 2006. Webelos Scouts should arrive no later than 8:30 AM. Webelos vehicles should park in the parking lot to the south of the dining hall. Registration for Webelos units will take place in the Brownville Shelter (Polar Cub Warming House). Webelos activities will start at 9:00 AM.

Webelos Scouts should partner with a Boy Scout Troop. The Webelos leaders and Boy Scout leaders should coordinate equipment, supplies, and food needed for the Webelos Scouts on Saturday.

If a Webelos Leader has any questions about partnering with a troop, contact your district executive.

Webelos Scouts do not spend the night on Saturday.

## **CAMPOREE PROGRAM**

The Rendezvous events will consist of the Voyageur's Challenge. The lower camp trail will be used. Along the trail 12 to 16 stations will be set up where scouts will stop and engage either in a skill activity or a game-type activity. These activities will be based on the skill and game activities of the Voyageurs when they gathered for their rendezvous.

The Camporee events will run from 9:00 AM through 1:30 PM. Troops and Webelos Scouts will then return to their campsites for lunch.



During the afternoon, from 2:30 to approximately 6:30, troops will begin their free time programs. These programs include black powder rifle shooting, .22 caliber rifle shooting, tomahawk throwing, the climbing tower, and archery. Scouts will be limited to 10 rounds on the .22 range and will get to load and fire a black powder rifle once. If time and demand permit, Boy Scouts may purchase an additional 10 rounds at the .22 range for 50¢. Except for the additional rifle rounds, participation in all of the free time events is included in your Camporee fee.

The Webelos program is somewhat different. Webelos free time runs from 9:00 AM through 1:00 PM. Free time activities for Webelos Scouts include BB Gun shooting, archery, and the climbing tower. Please note that Webelos Scouts are not allowed to rappel down the climbing tower but must be lowered on the safety ropes. All Webelos activities are included in the fee charged.

The afternoon session for the Webelos Scouts will include a running of the Voyageur's Challenge with stops at selected skill or game stations.

All troops, and Webelos partnered with those troops, will participate in the Voyageurs Rendezvous Iron Chef Competition. Prior to the Camporee a "secret ingredient" will be disclosed. Troops will be provided with the secret ingredient at the Camporee. The evening meal should include one dish using the secret ingredient. The dishes will be judged by a panel of Voyageurs and one troop will be the Voyageurs Iron Chef Troop.

On Friday night there will be a short camp-wide campfire. Saturday night will bring a longer campfire celebrating the Camporee with songs, skits, and fun.

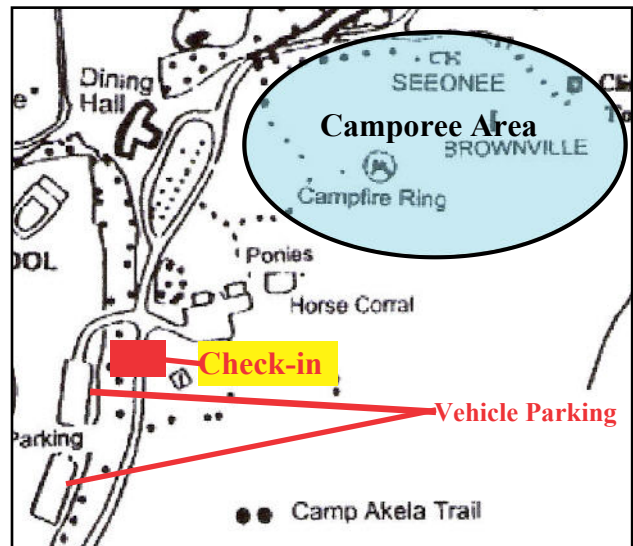
## **CAMPOREE CHECK-IN**

Please plan to arrive at the Camporee between 5:30 PM and 7:30 PM. on Friday evening, October 13, 2006. Webelos will arrive on Saturday morning before 8:30AM.

Parking for the Camporee will be in the parking lots just south of the dining hall. All vehicles will be directed to the designated parking lots at the time of your arrival. The troop trailer and vehicle pulling that trailer will be directed to the Camporee site where unloading will take place and then the trailer and vehicle will be directed to an assigned parking lot. Please park only where designated.

When you arrive, please have selected Scouts follow the trailer to the unloading area. We ask that your trailer be in this area only for the purpose of unloading. You will unload your equipment and drop it at the roadside.

Webelos Scouts checking in on Saturday morning should park in the lots south of the dining shelter and walk to the Camporee area. Camporee Headquarters will be located in the Polar Cub Warming Shelter. Please proceed there for further directions.



Boy Scout forms will be collected at the Roundtable on Friday night. Webelos forms will be collected on Saturday morning.

## **HEALTH AND PERMISSION FORMS**

As stated earlier, these forms SHOULD NOT be turned in at the time of your initial registration at the Council offices. Please bring these forms to the Camporee.

Please use the enclosed forms which are specific to this event. These forms will not be returned to the units and will be destroyed.

No Scout, Boy or Webelos, will be allowed to participate in any shooting sports activity without a properly signed permission form.

All Camporee participants (Scouts and adults) must provide a completed Health Form.

### **TROOP CAMPING**



Troops will camp jamboree style in the Father Brown Field (Polar Cub Field). Troops will be assigned designated camp sites and will be directed to those sites upon their arrival. Campsites will be designated based upon the troops' initial registration. Units must provide their own tents. Dining canopies may be brought to the site, but space may be limited for their set-up.

Troop campfires will be limited to the fire ring provided for each campsite. Firewood will be probably be at a premium at the Camporee. Troops are urged to bring their own firewood for their campfires.

Troops are urged to bring large water containers as water spigots are limited in the Camporee area. Please remember that brushing teeth, personal washing, and dishwashing are not allowed at the spigots.

### **ADULT TRAINING OFFERED**

The Northwest District Training Committee will offer New Leader Essentials and Youth Protection Training on Saturday, October 14th, at the Camporee. Times will be announced on Friday evening. New Leader Essentials is approximately 90 minutes long and Youth Protection Training will run about one hour. There is no fee and no need to pre-register. Training sessions will be held in the warming shelter.
